

IF THERE WAS A VACCINE TO PROTECT FROM CANCER WOULD YOU GET IT?

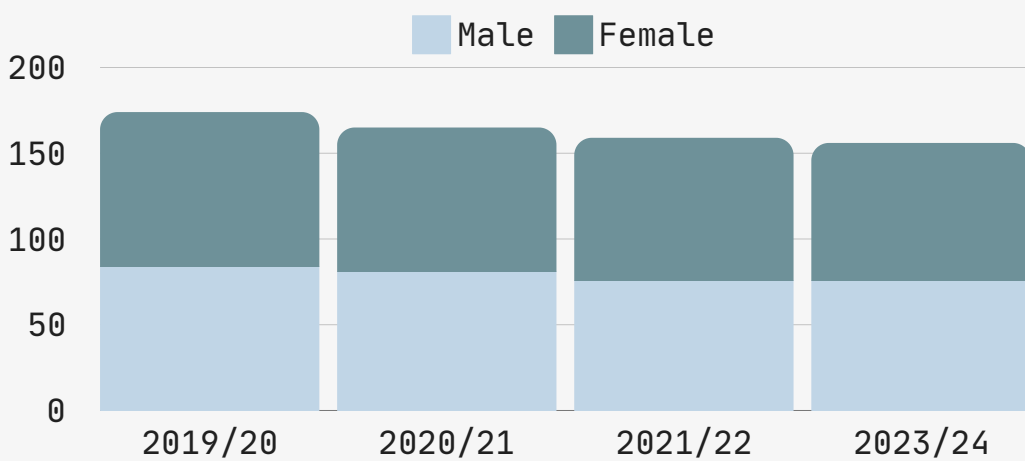
The UK has a population of 28.3 million women ages 15 years and older who are at risk of developing cervical cancer. The HPV vaccination can reduce this risk and prevent cancer.

women are diagnosed with cervical cancer each year



79% of invasive cervical cancers are attributed to HPV 16 or 18 and 3.2% of women are estimated to have a HPV 16/18 infection at any given time.



The percentage of males and females completing their HPV vaccination by year 9 has slowly been decreasing

Being protected is easy.

Say yes to the HPV vaccine when you are 11 or 12 years old. If you missed your vaccine contact the school nurse, Vaccination UK on 01724 514800 or your GP practice to arrange an appointment. All individuals, both male and female, remain eligible to receive the vaccine up until their 25th Birthday.
